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| <p>Submit a total of 10 head and neck ultrasound exams with corresponding final reports:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The cases must be from at least 3 of the 6 general head and neck categories:<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. salivary glands2. lymph nodes3. congenital lesions4. miscellaneous mass lesions5. infection and trauma6. endocrine• At least 2 of the 10 cases <u>MUST INCLUDE</u> fine needle aspiration for cytology. For FNA, image of the needle within the lesion must be demonstrated. | <p>Submit 1 head and neck ultrasound exam with a corresponding final report:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The case <u>MUST INCLUDE</u> fine needle aspiration for cytology. For FNA, image of the needle within the lesion must be demonstrated. |

| <p><u>Note:</u></p> <p>Images for each case should be complete and represent salient features sufficient to render an accurate diagnosis.</p> <p>If more than one physician at the practice performs/interprets head & neck ultrasounds, cases must be submitted by a representative sample of physicians.</p> <p>For the purpose of accreditation, all anatomy must be appropriately labeled (for example – TRV RT LOBE SUPERIOR).</p> | |
